



# Father Ken's Lenten Note

# Motivate Yourself To Be All That You Can Be — Don't be a "Wahlstrom's Wonder"

One of our national magazines carried a story some time ago about a man named Walstrom. He had built a machine called "Wahlstrom's Wonder." The machine got its start when Wahlstrom bought an old bombsight and began to tinker with it. He added parts of an alarm clock that wouldn't work as a clock. Through the years he has been adding wheels, belts, and cogs until today there are more than 10,000 parts in "Wahlstrom's Wonder."

Having put the contraption together, Mr. Wahlstrom entertains visitors with it. When he throws a switch, 3,000 parts begin to move while the whole apparatus revolves on a turntable. Bells ring, lights flash, and hundreds of wheels go around. Unhappily, "Wahlstrom's Wonder" doesn't do anything worth doing. It just runs. It is a monument to futility.



When I first read the story of "Wahlstrom's Wonder", it occurred to me that at times, I and at times many people, often are like a contraption that runs and runs and goes nowhere. Often, we as people, waste time flitting from one thing to another without finishing anything. We burn energy by the bushel, but we don't go anywhere. A businessman observed, concerning one of his employees, "He is busy. He is always busy, but he never gets anything done."

It is one thing to be occupying time, but it is something else to be using it as good stewards. It is one thing to be going round and round; it is something else to be going somewhere worth going. It is our task to discipline our time or, as the Scriptures say, "redeem the time, for growth of mind and spirit and for contribution to the common life of all."

Help me Heavenly Father during this Lent and beyond, to be a product of change, a vessel of growth, not a person that talks a lot and does nothing, that constantly moves and goes nowhere.

#### Do's and Don'ts of the DLA

Our annual Diocesan Lenten Appeal (DLA) has started. Up to this point in time some people have received their DLA letter sent by our diocese on behalf of each of our four parishes. Within the next week, all parishioners will receive a letter from our diocese again on behalf of each of our four parishes. This year each of our four parishes has seen an increase in the amount that our diocese requests us to raise on their behalf. As always, as each parish reaches its target request asked by our diocese, each dollar raised beyond that point is returned back to the parish. Please note the following: If any parish fails to reach the suggested target set by our diocese, then the amount that parish has fallen short will be billed to the parish. This means that one way or the other our diocese will receive from each parish what it requests. Has this actually every happened? Yes, for the 2023 DLA one parish out of the 78 parishes in our diocese failed to reach its goal, and received a bill from our diocese making up the difference between what the parish raised and the amount it fell short in reaching its goal. Remember if you do not want to give to DLA because you do not want to give to the diocese, they will still get their money. So in holding back, you are actually holding your parish back.

Please note that as each parish reaches its goal, and then exceeds its goal, the excess is returned back to the parish, TAX FREE. Again, TAX FREE. Also note that all offertory gifts that you give to your parish are heavily taxed by our diocese. All money raised beyond the DLA target for each parish is returned back to the parish TAX FREE. By this point you have to be realizing how important it is to give and the importance of giving that avoids the diocesan tax. Giving to the DLA with the hope of your parish getting above target, every gift you give to your parish, every penny you give to your parish, you should mark on the envelope as a DLA gift.

In conclusion, the returned funds above goal are TAX FREE; below goal, the shortfall is a bill to your parish. Every gift you give to your parish not marked as a DLA gift is HEAVILY TAXED.


