

Father Ken's Palm Sunday Note



Jesus went on toward Jerusalem...he sent two disciples ahead. "Go into that village over there," he told them. "As you enter it, you will see a young donkey tied there that no one has ever ridden. Untie it and bring it here" (Luke 19:28-30). Make this Palm Sunday extra special by sharing the Bible story with your family and friends, but told from the donkey's point of view! Let the heart of Easter come alive in this story and discover together the strength of Jesus at work in our weaknesses.

There was a donkey—young, weak, and small, so weak he could carry nothing at all. Even when children sat on his hide, he'd wobble and tumble and fall on his side. No matter how much he tried or he cried, this was a donkey that no one could ride. One day two men appeared alongside the post in the village where the donkey was tied. They came without warning on that fateful day. They came and untied him and took him away. The donkey was frightened. He said to the men, "Where are we going?" and then said again, "Where are we going?" And what about me? Please leave me alone and just let me be!" They walked on for miles and miles until they got to a town at the foot of a hill. At the foot of the hill stood a man tall and thin, wearing a cloak and a beard on his chin. He had eyes that seemed sad and longish dark hair, and a voice soft and gentle that floated on air.

He said to the donkey, "It's time that you knew about the great thing that you're destined to do. You'll carry Me into the city—we two. Into the city, I'll ride atop you. My help is enough; it's all that you need. It's all you require in life to succeed. The weaker you are, the more strength I give. I'll be there to help you as long as you live."

CATECHESIS CORNER - WHERE WILL YOU BE THIS WEEK?

It's Holy Week and the most important week in the Catholic Church year. Please come and participate with us. Holy Week includes the sacred events between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. It is a representation of Our Lord's journey to the Crucifixion of from the dead. Jesus loves us to the point of giving his life for us. We can all say He

and His Resurrection from the dead. Jesus loves us to the point of giving his life for us. We can all say He gave His life for me!

We begin Palm Sunday (liturgical color is red) crying out: Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! Mark 11:9. "**Hosanna**" is a call to God to "Save us, Please." Our liturgy today shouts Hosanna. How quickly this exaltation turns ugly and hateful.

The Triduum, (3 days), flows as 1 entire liturgy. Holy Thursday, (liturgical color is white) celebrates the Lord's institution of the priesthood and Holy Eucharist. Luke 22:19 "Do this in remembrance of me". No final blessing is given as the Blessed Sacrament is carried to a place of repose. The altar on Good Friday is completely bare. Jesus is not in the tabernacle on Good Friday (liturgical color is red). The Lord's Passion is proclaimed. The faithful venerate the cross, receive Holy Communion, and depart in silence with no final blessing.

The Triduum concludes with the Easter Vigil as our grief turns to joy and Alleluia's ring out. Learn all about it in next Catechesis Corner.

The Easter Triduum

The Triduum is the Church's endless reflection on a way of life that leads through the cross to the Resurrection. You are invited to come to the liturgies on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday at either Saint Mary, Saint Joseph, Saint Margaret Mary or Mount Saint Peter Parishes.

HOLY THURSDAY — March 28

6:30 pm St. Mary 7:00 pm St. Margaret Mary

At Saint Mary and Saint Margaret Mary, celebrate the joy of ministry that is the fabric of service to others. In the washing of the feet we come to a profound humility rooted in the example of Christ. On this same Holy Thursday night, we celebrate the arrival of the Holy Oils to our community: the Oil of Chrism, the Oil of the Sick, and the Oil of Catechumens. Saint Mary Holy Name is sponsoring a 7 Church Visit immediately following the 6:30 pm Mass.

GOOD FRIDAY – March 29
12:00 NN Mount Saint Peter
1:00 PM Saint Joseph

At Mount Saint Peter we will walk the steps to Calvary with Jesus. At Saint Joseph and Saint Margaret Mary, celebrate the ultimate mystery of the triumph of the cross. Unite your sufferings and those of the world with the Lord of the Cross. Venerate the cross, our sign of victory beyond pain and death. At Saint Mary, we will celebrate Tenebrae, the Latin word for darkness. It is characterized by increasing darkness by gradually extinguishing candles to symbolize the coming darkness of Jesus' death. Friday is the birth of hope and peace.

THE EASTER VIGIL - March 30

8:00 PM Mount Saint Peter 8:00 PM Saint Margaret Mary

At Mount Saint Peter and Saint Margaret Mary, we gather around the Easter bonfire as we proclaim Christ is our Light! Recall the history of salvation in word and song. Relive new life given in the waters of Baptism. Welcome new Christians and join us in the proclamation of the Resurrection and the refreshment of the Eucharist. Plan to be here for this liturgy, the highpoint of the liturgical year!



ON EASTER EVE

Place 1 cup of pecans in a zippered plastic bag and let children break them into pieces with a wooden spoon. Explain that Jesus was arrested and beaten by Roman soldiers.

Let each child smell the vinegar, and pour 1 teaspoon into a mixing bowl. Explain that Jesus was thirsty on the cross and was given vinegar to drink.

Add 3 egg whites, representing life, to the vinegar. **Explain that Jesus gave his life to give us life.**

Sprinkle salt into each child's hand. Let them taste it, and put a pinch into the bowl. Explain that this represents the salty tears shed by Jesus' disciples, and the bitterness of our own sins.

Add 1 cup of sugar. Explain that the sweetest part of the story is that Jesus died because he loves us. He wants us to know this, and how to belong to him.

Beat with a mixer on high speed until stiff peaks are formed. Explain that the color white represents our purity when God forgives our sins.

Fold in the nuts. Drop by teaspoons onto a cookie sheet covered in wax paper. Explain that each mound represents the rocky tomb where Jesus' body was laid.

Put the cookie sheet in a 300 degree Fahrenheit oven, close the door and turn the oven *off!* Give each child a piece of tape and seal the oven door. **Explain that Jesus' tomb was sealed.**

Go to bed! Explain that they may feel sad leaving the cookies in the oven overnight, just as Jesus' disciples were miserable when the tomb was sealed.

On Easter day, open the oven and give everyone a cookie. Notice the cracked surface, and take a bite. The cookies are hollow! On the first Easter, Jesus' followers were amazed to find the tomb open and empty! Jesus is alive!

Read the Easter story together on Easter Sunday before dinner, and enjoy the cookies for dessert.
